1002 N. Weber/230 Yampa Rehabilitation

Winter, Kramer & Jessup completed historic structure assessments of 25 contributing residential structures owned by Colorado College as part of the Colorado College East Campus Restoration and Rehabilitation Plan. The plan included a framework for their technical rehabilitation, as well as long-term management and maintenance strategies. The plan, partially funded by the Colorado Historical Fund (CHF) was completed in March of 1999.

As part of the Plan, the residence at 1002 N. Weber, originally recorded as 230 Yampa, was rehabilitated as a Fraternity House. In addition to the technical rehabilitation of the structure, code compliance issues, such as accessibility, were addressed. WKJ completed full architectural services for this project.



The residence at 1002 N. Weber, Colorado Spring, CO, was technically restored as part of the Colorado College East Campus Restoration and Rehabilitation Plan performed by Winter, Kramer & Jessup in March of 1999.
