
Denver National Western Center Cultural Resource Plan and Placemaking Strategy

The National Western Center in Denver is undergoing redevelopment as a place that looks to innovation in food production and farming while maintaining its position as the preeminent stock show in the nation and a venue for a wide range of cultural events while respecting its heritage. The City and County of Denver, in partnership with the National Western Stock Show and Colorado State University, is engaged in planning for the rejuvenation of the site. Many new facilities will showcase creativity in design, sustainability and programming and a considerable number of historic resources will remain as anchors to the past.





Design guidelines will then be crafted to help assure that improvements will meet the objectives for the character of the place.
